# The Year Past and the Year Ahead

A quotation from Martin Luther King Jnr goes: "If you can't fly then run; if you can't run then walk; if you can't walk then crawl; but whatever you do, you must keep moving forward!"

I was again reminded of it as I looked back on

the past 12 months. While we may not quite be flying yet, we are certainly moving forward! As to whether, however, we are running, crawling or walking, you will have to be the judge.

As 2015 comes to a close and 2016 gets underway, I thought it might be interesting for us to explore our progress in just a few of the areas we, as a Grand Lodge, have been working on.

Firstly, let us consider our various Education initiatives. As a Grand Lodge we have standardised on the "Masonic Book of Life" as our basic Education offering. This document is handed out, in printed form, to every Brother as he progresses through our Order. When he is initiated he is given a folder with all the material related to the Apprentice degree together with various items on our history, structures and activities. As he progresses through his 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> degrees our Brother is given further material related to his level of advancement while he is given yet more content as he is installed as the Master of his Lodge.

All of this material is available, in electronic form, to every single member of our Grand Lodge, dependant on your status. We will also create accessible databases which will provide still more papers related to each degree and are exploring the most effective ways of providing effective mentoring.

You should also know that the Constitution, Laws and Regulations will be included in the "Book

of Life" and will appear on our Grand Lodge web site. This will enable us to make sure that it is readily accessible to our Members and will further ensure that everybody is working on the most recent version.

As a further Education initiative we are about to launch a Ritual Excellence program. This is being spearheaded by RW Bro Alan van der Vyver and will enable our Brethren to be measured on their ritual skills. In this program Brethren will be evaluated as they progress and will receive formal recognition of their successes. It supports our philosophy that every Brother is entitled to a Quality experience - and high standard ritual work is an absolute essential.

Another key initiative that we are about to introduce is our new online, interactive Membership Management System and we will be using American software specifically designed for Grand Lodges. This is being spearheaded by RW Bro Avron Jacobson and will benefit all of our members as we will be better able to provide you with information. It will also assist us in monitoring our progress as a Grand Lodge and generally simplify our administration processes.

On a slightly different topic, I was recently asked the question "What is the GLSA's reason for being?" As this is very relevant when we consider our 2020 Vision campaign, let me try to provide a simple definition. "The GLSA exists to create an environment where good men can bond together in fraternal harmony as they seek to enhance their own life and the lives of those around them by the application of the Masonic precepts of truth, morality, brotherly love and charity." While growth is absolutely essential to ensure our long-term future, it should never be considered as our reason for being.

For practical reasons, however, Vision 2020's growth objectives remain extremely important and I have recently updated you on the progress of some of our more successful Lodges. We are now presenting the "What is Freemasonry?" ritual in several Divisions with significant success. This ritual not only targets potential candidates but is also useful to educate our newer members, our wives and our families. Let me repeat what I have said before - as far as recruitment is concerned, it really does not matter what you do, as long as you do something! There really are many, many suitable men who are interested in becoming Freemasons and we are each personally responsible for making very sure that we are visible and available.

There are, of course, other initiatives being implemented and 2016 promises to be a most exciting year. It will be a privilege to share it with you.

There were 70 Grand Lodges present and we were able to both renew old contacts and establish many new ones.

Friday night was memorable with an excellent dinner being served while cruising on the Seine, on Saturday there was the annual meeting and the reinstallation of MW Bro Phillip Serval with  $\pm$  1500 Freemasons present, while on Saturday there was a Grand Banquet with 700 guests, including partners.

This project supports a block of flats and 3 communal houses for Senior Citizens and a specially designed Home for Quadriplegics. Future dreams include such facilities as Homes for Children and Abused Women. The financial success of the evening is totally dependent on the support and efforts of the Lodges, the Brethren and their wives, partners and friends.

## The Deputy Grand Masters of the Netherlands 1 - Jacob de Mist (1800 - 1805)

It is an interesting fact that, of the 4 constitutions present in South Africa up until the mid  $20^{\text{th}}$  century, only the Netherlandic appointed a single Brother to formally represent the Supreme Authority throughout the whole of its South African jurisdiction. His title was the Deputy Grand Master National of the Netherlands. Over the next 160 odd years, this prestigious but extremely challenging position was held by no more than 9 men – and it is these men that we will introduce over the months ahead.

It was in the years around 1800 that the first Deputy Grand Master of the Netherlands appears in our records and, indeed, he had an enormous impact in laying our Masonic foundations. Jacob de Mist was Commissary General of Batavia and was despatched to Cape Town to "form a Government" and "promote the prosperity of the people". He was acknowledged as a far-seeing Statesman while, at the same time, he performed exceptional Masonic work amongst the Brethren involved in the Lodges at the time. Described as "a determined though mild revolutionary", he was a man of extremely high principles and impeccable integrity. During his few, very successful years based in Cape Town, he promoted fraternal interaction, formalised the Lodge structures and consecrated the new de Goede Hoop Temple – which had been built at a cost of some £10,000 or the equivalent of a little more than R30,000 in today's values. He was also well thought of in his profane activities and, amongst his accomplishments, he was responsible for Cape Town's

coat of arms. By the time this "man of imposing figure" finally took his leave of the Cape at the beginning of 1805, he had left an unforgettable legacy.

# A "Bleed off" in the Free State.

While it is generally accepted that many of our members are prepared to sweat blood for the good of our Order, our Brethren in Central Division gave it a more literal interpretation!!!

In early November 2015, Lodge Bultfontein (No 123), together with Lodge Central Free State (No 35) had a "bleed off."

The Worshipful Master, Br James Meyer, as well as WM Jack Coetzee, allowed themselves to be dressed in "prisoners" clothing for the day. They were captured, loaded into the back of a police pick-up van



and taken to "prison." This took the form of a tent that had been erected at the local flea market venue for the occasion.

The "release" of our two Worshipful Masters depended entirely on the amount of units of blood collected by the local blood bank (SANBS). The Brethren of both Lodges rallied to the cause in persuading all of the members of the public known to them to donate blood and in so

doing, secured their release.

This was the Lodge's first effort at helping with the collection of blood and was a huge success. The norm in the past has averaged 75 units for the day. Assisted by the efforts of the Freemasons, the SANBS were able to increase this number to 134 units.

Well done Brethren for making a difference in your community and showing the true colours of our caring Order.

They arrived in ones, twos and bigger groups and the total started to reach closer and closer to the 80 people that were being catered for.

While the men stood around the fires and started turning the meat, our good ladies began offering wine, juice and cold drinks to those that had gathered under the carport where tables and chairs were arranged for the luncheon. At first, the elderly folks were quiet and looked wonderingly at these men and women who had gathered on their premises. As the time wore on, they started chatting to each other, the Lodge members and our ladies.

Lunch was served at 12pm and was very well received as the very appetising mixture of meats and salads was presented. Lunch being enjoyed in the open air and not within their dining hall, made a real difference and all present agreed that there was something very special about being exposed to the fresh air and to the beautiful day. After the lunch the Brethren and their ladies were heartily thanked for a well planned and executed event which the elderly folks had much enjoyed.

This event has been a success with the elderly for a number of years but this was the first time that the event was held on the Masonic Haven premises.
