In Memory: R.W.Bro. John F Kerr P.G. Master of Down



It is with deep regret and sadness that we have to inform you of sudden the passing of our esteemed R.W. Brother John Fraser Kerr, Tuesday 3rd

December 2002. Initiated in Felicitas Lodge No. 760 in November 1959, he was Worshipful Master in 1971. His active interest in the affairs of the Province was reflected in the successive Offices to which he was called:- P.G. Supt. of Works 1986; Hon.P.P. Junior Grand Warden 1991; P. Asst. Grand Master 1994; P. Deputy Grand Master 2000 and Provincial Grand Master in 2001. As a Chartered Surveyor, he used his skills to great effect in the maintenance and uplifting of Masonic properties in the Province. R.W. Bro. Kerr also held the position of Chairman of the Corinthian Housing Association. Such was his work for and commitment to all levels of the Order, he had been elevated to the 28°.

To his Widow and family circle we tender our sincere sympathy.

In Memory:-M.E.C. Alan S Watt M.B.E.; J.P.



Alan S Watt, a Scotsman, was born in the Shetland Islands and following the 2nd World War his family moved to Liverpool. He was conscripted

for National Service from 1949 to 1951. In 1958 he started a printing company in Belfast and in 1959 he opened an office in Dublin, followed soon afterwards with further expansion to his operation in London, Glasgow and Edinburgh. He married in 1955 and has 3 children.

In 1971 he was appointed a Justice of the Peace and later in 1996 he was honoured with the M.B.E. Alan is a Past President of the Belfast Benevolent Society of St. Andrew; Vice President of the Royal

Scottish Pipe Band Association and currently Vice President of the RUC Football Club.

As a Mason, he was initiated in Lodge 427 in 1964and was W. Master in 1972. He also affiliated to Lodge 763 and served 2 Grand Masters as Standard Bearer in 1980 and 1981. Alan was elected as Junior Warden at Grand Lodge in 2000 and Senior Grand Warden in 2001. He became a Royal Arch Mason of Chapter 427 in 1968 and appointed District Grand King of Antrim in 1997. He represented Western Australia at Grand Chapter.

As a Knight Templar he was invited to join Unity Preceptory in 1972 and as a Foundation Member of Liscoole Preceptory was the Em. Preceptor in 1981. In 1995 he was made an Honorary Past Great Constable of the Great Priory of Ireland.

He became a member of Prince Mason's Chapter No. 5, was M.W.S. in 1988, received the 28th Degree in 1989, the 30th Degree in 1995; the 31st Degree in 1998 and the 32nd Degree in November 2002. He is also a member of the Royal Order of Scotland.

M.E.C. Watt passed away suddenly on 8th January 2003 while on a cruise in the Caribbean with his wife Shelagh and daughter. Our sincere sympathy is extended to his Widow and family circle.

Three Generations in Bellaghy 291

Andrew Robert Overend, the 20th member of the Overend family to join Bellaghy Temperance Masonic Lodge 291, received his EA degree at the February 2002 meeting of the Lodge. His father, Wor. Bro. Robert A. Overend, Lodge Secretary, his grand father Wor. Bro. Robert Overend senior, who has been an active member of the Lodge for 52 years, and his two uncles, Bro. Wesley Overend and Bro. Nigel Overend, were present on this special occasion.

The Overend association with the Lodge stretches back to its formation when Silas Overend, a member of Lodge 532, together with seven other Brethren, was granted Warrant number 291 in December 1900. Silas Overend the founder member in 1900 began a family tradition, which has lasted 101 years and is still going strong. Throughout this time four sons, six grandsons, six great grandsons, three relatives and Andrew, a great, great grandson have all joined the Lodge. There are currently eight members of the Overend family on the roll of the Lodge and several more waiting in the wings.
